

Corpora Addition

Statement of Intent

These corpora additions are long overdue with how prevalent drinking culture is within our larping culture. Having the people who are supposed to be in charge of safety decisions and of the event impaired by intoxication and thus unable to make sound decisions is something that should be addressed. The second in command is not the person who should be making safety decisions or the call if medical attention is needed that the site can't provide. This is a way to ensure all decisions coming from those who are in charge of our safety and in charge of the event overall are made while sober and coherent. This also ensures that decisions are not made after drinking has been done by any of the bodies that make those decisions. If you are intoxicated, you cannot consent nor can you make ruling decisions. This is not removing drinking to intoxication from events, but it is saying those who wish to take responsibility by running an event should be held to a higher standard when doing so.

8.0.2 - If a member is the Autocrat, Medical Crat, or Security Crat, they are not to partake in alcohol or substances for the purpose of being intoxicated for the duration of the event.

8.0.3. If something happens that requires the Monarchy, BOD, or the event staff to discuss punishments or confront somebody, all members participating must be sober at the time. If not, then the discussion shall happen when all parties are no longer intoxicated.

Reason for addition - 8.0.2

The Autocrat, Medical Crat, and Security Crat are the first line if an accident or incident happens. Even with staff, if something happens while that staff is busy, it is the head of the department who is responsible for taking care of what comes up. If one of those people is intoxicated, then they are unable to make the decisions that will keep the populace safe.

Reason for addition - 8.0.3

The Monarchy, the BOD, and the event staff are the ones that have to deal with incidents. If something is to be decided at an event due to a major incident, then all members involved need to be sober. If you are intoxicated, you cannot make decisions for yourself or others.
